Imagine a video camera spinning in space. It passes over Glasgow – what does it see? To celebrate Kelvingrove's reopening, Dalziel + Scullion looked at the shortness of human life against the backdrop of the earth spinning in its orbit. By taking their camera into offices, shops, streets, bars, community centres and parks, and filming beautiful images of people in Scotland's most diverse and vibrant city, they have created a moving portrait of Glasgow and Glaswegians. Even if you know Glasgow well you may catch a glimpse of somewhere new or unexpected.

Artists Mathew Dalziel and Louise Scullion have worked in collaboration since 1993. Their work explores the increasing urbanization of our population and questions how our estrangement from nature will affect our survival.

Craig Armstrong is one of the world's most sought-after and respected composers and arrangers. He has won several awards, including a Grammy for the score for the film *Ray*.
